#### THE 1995 MEETING

Recently the Executive Board voted without dissent to accept the offer of Case Western Reserve University (as forwarded by Professor P.K.Saha, English, Case Western Reserve University) to host the 1995 biennial meeting. This, the Tenth Biennial meeting, will therefore be held in Cleveland July 20-22, 1995. #### **NEWS FROM MEMBERS**

John ALGEO, current Vice-President of DSNA, has retired from the University of Georgia as Professor Emeritus of English this past June. Since August 1993 he has been President of the Theosophical Society in America.

D.J. VAN SCHALKWYK, replying to a query in the last Newsletter, informs us that lexicography is taught at the universities of Pretoria, Stellenbosch, Western Cape and the University of South Africa. Edward GATES attended the International Symposium on Lexicography at the University of Leeds in England, April 18-20, 1994. He reports that "14 papers were presented on the structure

and use of word combinations fixed by convention, including collocations and idioms. A variety of theoretical and practical concerns were represented—computer corpora, translation, stylistic analysis, and first and second language acquisition. Nearly 80 people from 15 countries attended the symposium, organized by Anthony Cowie of the School of English and Peter Howarth of the English Language Unit." Publication of the proceedings is under consideration.

#### AMERICAN HERITAGE USAGE PANEL

Antonin Scalia, Associate Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, has been elevated to membership on the American Heritage Dictionary Usage Panel, and thus joins 160 journalists, critics, writers, politicians, actors, and television personalities, plus Jacques Barzun (a non-native speaker), who decide on the acceptability and meaning of such terms as "significant other," "quality" as an adjective meaning "good," and the pronunciation of "envelope."

#### TAMIL DICTIONARY DISPUTE

The Managing Editor of the Dictionary of Contemporary Tamil (S.Ramakrishnan), has charged that the copyright of this work has been infringed by the Institute of Indology at the University of Cologne and has instituted legal

proceedings. The specific claim is that the Institute has placed the material on line in INTERNET and has also issued a German version without permission of the copyright holder. Tamil is the Dravidian language spoken in South India by inhabitants of Madras and in part of Ceylon. We have no information about any response from the University of Cologne.
